POETRY

This month's poet is JEFF NUTTALL from Bradford. Breaking with our recent poetry reading tradition, Jeff will be doing his thing in our new Artshop in Blackburn, instead of the usual stately surroundings of Gawthorpe Hall. He was born in Clitheroe in 1933 went through the usual channels of grammar school and art schools and now describes himself as "painter, sculptor, jazz musician, poet, comedian and polemicist".

MUSIC

Our lone music offering is from a group called TRITON. Made up of Sasha Abrams, soprano, Dan Klein, tenor, and pianist Peter Alexander, they will be giving two completely different performances on successive nights. In Oswaldtwistle they will be giving their version of "The Musical Life of Queen Victoria and Prince Albert". The story is told using extracts not only from Victoria and Albert's letters, and speeches and music by such as Liszt, Mendelssohn and Rossini, but also a composition by Albert himself! The following night, in Barrowford, the programme will be "Mozart's English Friends", an entertainment based, mainly on the autobiography of Irish tenor Michael Kelly for whom Mozart wrote many songs.
