SCOTTISH OPERA'S "The Lion, the Witch, and The Wardrobe" is an opera by C. S. Lewis, music is by John McCabe and libretto by Gerald Larner. Gawthorpe Hall, Padiham, is an annexe of Nelson and Colne College of Further Education. The MPAA and the college have co-operated to mount a week long summer festival which has something to suit most tastes.

In the music field the week starts with the ENGLISH CONSORT OF VIOLS. Founded in the 1950's the group exists to promote and perform the 16th and 17th century viol music in which the

17th century viol music in which the English composers of that period ex-celled. The five viol players are joined on this occasion by Julian Creme (lute) and Martyn Hill (tenor). Included in the ticket price is a strawberry supper. By way of a contrast to the traditional sounds of the viols, GENTLE FIRE are a group who perform up-to-the-minute modern music. It concerns itself with the exploration of timbre made possible by the electronic modification of instruby the electronic modification of instru-

by the electronic modification of instruments; both traditional such as trumpet, cello, piano, and percussion, and others made specially to meet the demands of the score. The group has an international reputation and a repertoire of works by such as Cage, Kagel, and Stockhausen.

Back to the traditional and the AYRE CONSORT, with the help of THEATRE-MOBILE, will be creating a Renaissance evening entitled "When Fickle Fortune Smiled". An evening of letters, music, poems, and pictures from the Renaissance period. A buffet supper is included in the ticket price.

THE CITY OF COVENTRY BAND is recognised as one of Britain's best brass bands. The popularity of these two specialists in Lancashire folk songs needs no further proof. As well as this wide variety of music, children will be catered for with Punch and Judy puppet shows by SCARAMOUCHE & CO., and no festival at Gawthorpe would be complete with-SCARAMOUGHE & C.D., and no restrial at Gawthorpe would be complete without a poet. We have been very lucky to secure DANNIE ABSE, the Welsh poet, who will read selections of his own work. Born in Cardiff in 1923, he has had four books of his poems published.
