EXHIBITIONS

PAUL JOHNSON transfers from our Burnley gallery to the Artshop in Blackburn for May. His style, which has evolved from studying mediaeval European and Persian miniatures, has created quite a lot of interest.

Also in the Artshop during this month will be an exhibition of pottery from THE WETHERIGGS POTTERY Penrith. The pottery itself is registered as an ancient industrial monument, having been in continuous use since 1855. All the pots are made in traditional manner and are functional rather than decorative; made to be used in the home and kitchen especially.

Local teacher WILLIAM LONSDALE occupies our Burnley gallery. He is presently teaching at Burnley Grammar School after living in Germany for six years. This is his first local one-man show.

WHITWORTH SPRING EXHIBITION AND GRAND MUSIC/POETRY JAMBOREE, FEATURING ADRIAN HENRI, ROGER MCGOUGH, ANDY ROBERTS & POEM.

For all the stay at homes the MPAA and Whitworth High School have organised a unique Spring weekend celebration at Whitworth High School. Paintings by Adrian Henri; John Moore Prizewinner and Merseyside Poet, form the centrepiece to an exhibition of paintings, drawings and other art forms by professional and amateur artists. Adrian will be reading his poetry (admission free) at 1 p.m. each day accompanied by Andy Roberts. On Saturday night at 7.30 p.m. Adrian Henri and Andy Roberts are joined by Roger McGough and 'Poem' for an

evening of music and poetry, often funny, often sad, and always entertaining. EXHIBITION OPEN 10 a.m. to 8 p.m.

MUSIC

The famous young German violinist ULF HOELSCHER did not make an appearance in this country until 1971. His London debut was sensational. The Times even calling him a latter-day Orpheus. He has since made two return visits, each time to large and enthusiastic audiences. He will be accompanied by the American pianist Michael Isador.

Earlier in the same day there will be a special children's concert given by flautist ATARAH BEN TOVIM and members of the Royal Liverpool Philharmonic Orchestra. The programme, and prices, have been specially arranged to provide an introduction to music for children of all ages. Children will be encouraged to participate in singing and clapping and are especially asked to bring 'something to blow'.

POEM are a three-piece folk group who, as their name implies, play gentle, poetic music. Between them they play twelve different instruments, including glockenspiel, dulcimer, melodica, and electric organ, as well as the usual banjos and guitars. Well worth listening to.
