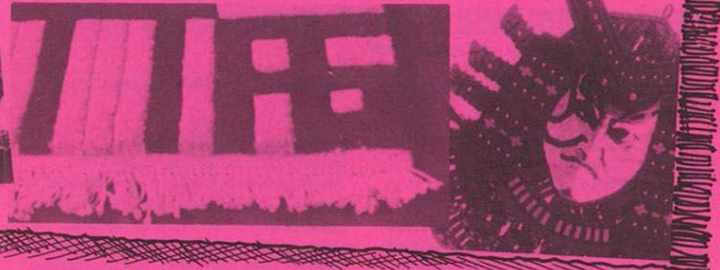
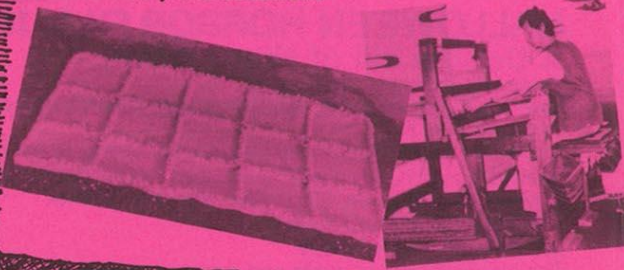
an exhibition of rugs and hangings

The classic simplicity of Steve Wilson's plain weave rugs, and the quiet restraint of Lindsay Gray's woven rugs and hangings contrast with wall-hangings by Anne Jackson based on masks and faces and incorporating knotting, embroidery and beadwork.

Juliet Goodden's strong geometric designs, hand-knotted by craftsmen in Tibet, are quite different from Alison Morton's rag rugs or the work of Anne Mulcahy reminiscent at first glance of land and sea-scapes.

A range of work by Rosemary Walmesley-White and other craftsmen from the Seion Weaving Centre working mainly in natural hand-dyed wools contributes further to the extensive range of designs and techniques brought together from many parts of Britain for a quite spectacular "Floor Show"!

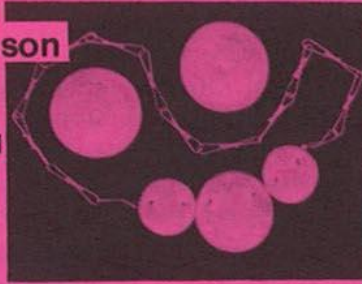

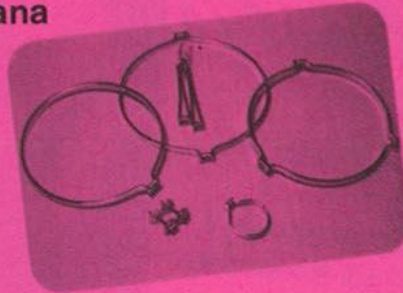


OCTOBER Liz Oakley

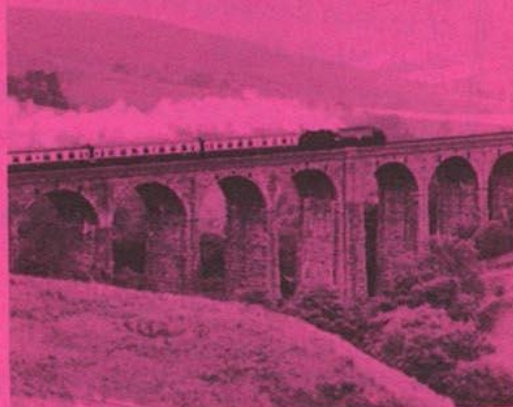
Large scale, light weight jewellery with a feeling of space. Wire and silver combined with non-precious metals in bold designs and strong colours.
