
### MAINSPACE

He first achieved renown in the late 60's producing work which acted as an incisive, sometimes ironic, commentary on debates surrounding conceptual art of that time - such as his famous 'Self Burial' now in the Tate Gallery.






Howarth Art Gallery, Accrington
