



A deliberate mix of animal and human, Oliver Langham's sculptures have a "life" of their own. Yet their precise delicate movements are all carefully controlled, using wit and understatement to stimulate curiosity, and thus the active participation of the viewer.

Classical forms and contrasting bold abstract patterns in vibrant colours combine in this collection of decorative ceramics from artist-potter, Andrew Mason. The surface patterns are lively and spontaneous with an attractive painterly quality, enhanced by the individuality granted each pot by the raku firing process.

Andrew Mason is well respected both in this country and abroad, and was selected to represent the Crafts Council in California last year.




