



Martin's work is driven by the potential within the material he uses. He has a liking for things which have a history of use, to save them and re-apply them in a different context. For the most part these are found materials which bear a history of marks, the scars of usage, the effects of weather and time.

Through working these raw materials on a particular theme and by utilising their inherent

qualities in as direct a way as possible he transforms them, giving them a new value which is open to different interpretations. In the making each work is a journey of discovery, thought - provoking and deeply evocative.

BENEATH THE WAVES Glass by Malcolm Sutcliffe

29 May until 3 July

Creatures of the deep feature in Malcolm Sutcliffe's unique range of bowls, dishes and plates. Blown and shaped in the usual way, using varying techniques the works have colours of blue, black, white and green applied to dramatic effect.



Clean, smooth, simple shapes offer a surface similar to that of a canvas for the

images to be sandblasted on. Watery themes of dolphins and whales leap and dive through the surf around the bowls. His latest work goes beneath the waves and submerges into the deep blue sea with the humpback whales.

The delicacy of the decoration on these papier mache pieces by Juliette is a delight to the eye. Vessels, jewellery, elaborate functional furniture for interiors are all given this very special treatment which produces objects in vivid vibrant colours.

Norman Ackroyd demonstrates the art of etching, from preliminary sketches made on the White Horse Hill to completing the print in his studio.

He explains the techniques at each stage of the process, describes his involvement with the materials and the way in which he builds up the desired effect from proof to proof.

The artists who have influenced him are discussed and he demonstrates the special qualities of etching in the portrayal of light, in which the white paper that is left is as important as the black marks that are made, and its power to create an emotional atmosphere.

If it meets these few conditions, your project can take any form from rustic crafts to video.


