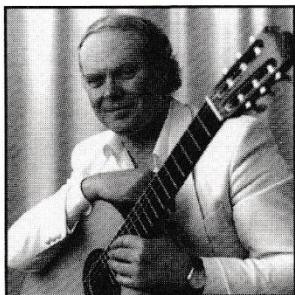
JOHN MILLS plays GUITAR

Haworth Art Gallery, Accrington

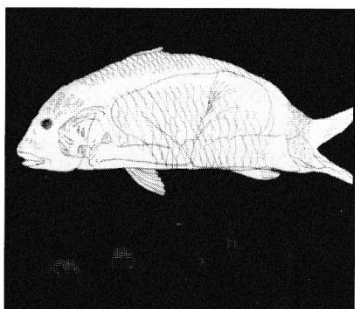

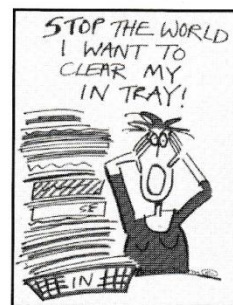

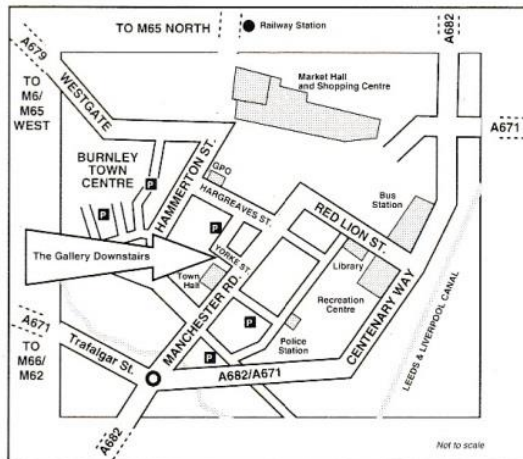
AND YOUR LOCAL PROJECT
