





• 15 January to 19 February




Large brightly coloured images appear to float on the walls. Unconfined by rectangular frames they expand across white walls, making the background an essential part of the painting Saleem uses cut - out wooden shapes on which layers of sand and paint are put down like geological strata, the colour shimmering through one layer to the next. Deceptively simple flat silhouettes of men and beasts interweave echoing ancient archetypes. His work has a rare quality, calm and subtle with a unique clarity of image. Saleem will be resident in the Gallery during his exhibition. See under Workshops for details.

CARVED AND PAINTED

Kathryn O'Kell

Smooth surfaces, flowing curves and tactile shapes characterize Kathryn's images of birds and fish. Ideas flow from life drawings, but also from folklore and mythology. Theses are translated on to English hardwoods and reclaimed pine.




English hardwoods and reclaimed pine. She uses techniques which include burning to enrich the painted colours and accentuate the grain.

Carlo Giovanni Verda




- Proposed by a local community group


