



Taiko literally means drum. Taiko drumming is a traditional folk art of Japan, originally played at village festivals, temples and shrines and used in rice planting ceremonies, to call for rain and to protect the village against plague and famine. Nowadays it has developed into an exciting visual performing art.

The show is energetic, visual, humorous as well as giving an insight into Japanese folk culture. It starts with a Japanese folktale and an explanation of the festival clothing the drummers wear. The children will be introduced to the drums and percussion instruments and learn how to perform a Japanese rhythm.

From fashion to sport to home furnishings, many of these items have been made using child labour. Iqbal Masih was one such child. 'Sold' at the age of four to a carpet factory he spent six years shackled to a loom for up to 16 hours per day. Freed by activists he began his world wide campaign on behalf of an exploited workforce. Iqbal received international acclaim for highlighting the horrors of child labour. One day whilst out riding his bicycle he was shot and killed. He was 12 years old.

Inspired by Iqbal's life, the renowned Ludus Dance Company bring 'SOLD' an explosive 55 minutes of dance theatre. Aimed at young people and specifically designed to tie-in with National Curriculum, schools will be offered workshops, INSET and the opportunity to see this exciting show.

The Autumn term sees the return of the highly acclaimed company M6 with a newly commissioned play, 'Trouble'. (Suitable for 10-13 years). Nicky, 12, has been excluded from school again. She's on the embankment with a brick in her hand. Ozzy, 68, is on the train after another stupid row with his daughter. The brick hits him. Now he's had enough as well. This play charts the emotional landscape of two people linked by rage and frustration and their journey to understanding.

The new piece looks at disaffection and exclusion inside and outside school, raising issues of self-esteem and anger and their effect on young people's behaviour. 'Trouble' has been extensively researched with education, welfare and psychology service, youth and social workers, the police and of course young people themselves.
