

INTRODUCING

THE MID-PENNINE ASSOCIATION FOR THE ARTS

This Association has been set up "to foster and promote the maintenance, improvement and development of artistic tastes and knowledge, understanding and appreciation of the fine arts and dramatic art among the inhabitants of the Mid-Pennine area" of North East Lancashire and the adjacent parts of the West Riding.

One of the main aims of the Association is to provide a theatre and arts centre for the whole area, where not only plays but also films, concerts, opera and ballet can be given, which has space for exhibitions of pictures and photographs, a licensed restaurant, coffee bars and club rooms, and which is a centre of activity all day long and not merely during performances.

This is a long term objective and will require help from many sources. The Association, which is a registered charity and is non-profit making, is affiliated to the North West Arts Association, and is hoping to receive a grant from this as well as from the Arts Council of Great Britain. It is bound to rely mainly, however, on local interest and support, and in order to help to create this as well as to provide enjoyment in the present and not only in the future, ten Local Authorities, viz. Barnoldswick, Barrowford, Brierfield, Burnley, Colne, Nelson, Oswaldtwistle, Padiham, Todmorden and Trawden, have agreed to subscribe the product of a farthing rate in order to subsidise artistic activities in the accommodation at present available, whether it be public or private halls, schools or colleges. Burnley Rural District, while not belonging to the Association, has made a donation of £100 for this purpose.

These events include public lectures, exhibitions, film shows, opera, ballet, concerts, and a visit by the Century Theatre in 1968. If you miss an event in one centre, you can go to it in another. The information you need in order to do this and to ensure that you do not miss anything is all contained in the following pages of this booklet.
