

OTHER ACTIVITIES

As well as the many and varied events and activities detailed in this brochure, Mid-Pennine Arts Association also organises and supports many other local events.

Mid-Pennine Arts Association's Arts Team comprises a music specialist and a dance specialist, both with drama training. They work primarily within communities animating arts activities, but also offer workshops to educational establishments, senior citizens, youth leaders and disabled groups. They have produced a booklet entitled "Activities for 3 - 5 year olds" which is available from MPAA (price 20p) and are currently preparing booklets on drama and inflatables.

Our work within the education system includes performances and workshops by selected dance, theatre and music companies who specialise in work with schools. Large scale events are placed in central venues and pupils are transported in from many schools over a wide area. Performances and workshops by artists and companies are also arranged in individual schools, giving the opportunity for more intensive work. MPAA is also a regular host to students on secondment from arts and business management courses. We have had students from Ilkley College, Bretton Hall and Nelson and Colne College over the past year and we also deal with many requests from students for advice on careers and information on the arts for projects and in-school work.

We have also been pleased to associate ourselves with established local societies, such as the Todmorden Orchestra and Burnley Municipal Orchestra, by bringing young professional artists to appear with them, and the Burnley Youth Theatre, by the provision of professionally led workshops. Local groups also benefit from a range of activities, such as small performances and continuing workshops sessions organised in response to requests from hospitals, mentally handicapped youngsters, community centres and church groups. We also make provision within our publicity budget for advertisements in programmes produced by local groups, thus spreading information on our events and services wider and at the same time helping to support local activities.

Staging, lighting and costumes are available for hire or loan from our arts resource service, a list of which can be obtained from our office. Our Gallery and Information Centre also houses a bookstall with many small press poetry publications, puppet books, postcards, Arts About Manchester Performance Tokens and poetry posters. The information files contain technical manuals, details of arts events all over the country, arts courses, major arts awards and competitions and we also subscribe to a number of arts magazines which are on display for you to read. Please visit us!

We can provide a speaker to give a talk to local groups giving background information about MPAA and the arts or put you in contact with speakers from many other arts organisations.


