

DAVID GLASS presents "THE WHITE WOMAN" and "STORIES"

Since his last visit here eighteen months ago, David Glass has added considerably to his already excellent reputation as a very accomplished and original mime artist. Taking his training and inspiration from the innovative French mime Jaques Le Coq, David has developed a unique style and technique which will be shown to its full in the two separate programmes he is presenting for us. 'The White Woman' is David's latest piece: set to the dynamic music of Grace Jones and Talking Heads (amongst others), the piece tells the story of the White Woman's escape from the city, her journey through the wilderness and her eventual demise and death. 'Stories' has less of a narrative theme, being a varied collection of entertaining mime pieces, which David has added to his considerable repertoire over the last few years. 
