

A day tour visiting Abbot Hall Art Gallery and the associated Museum of Lakeland Life & Industry, followed by a concert!
The Hall is an impressive Georgian building, and contains many fine items of local origin and national importance, including a comprehensive collection of portraits by George Romney. The beautifully-proportioned rooms contain 18th century porcelain, silver, glass and watercolours, and at the time of our visit the national biennial exhibition of the Association of Guilds of Weavers, Spinners and Dyers will be on show. The stable block holds reconstructions of workshops and intimate farmhouse rooms, nostalgically capturing the unique flavour of everyday life in the Lake District. The evening performance by the Lakeland Sinfonia is at the South Lakeland Leisure Centre, with a pleasantly-ranging programme conducted by Richard Deakin: Mozart – Clarinet Concerto (Soloist Janet Hilton): Handel – Entry of the Queen of Sheba; Boyce – 7th Symphony: Vivaldi – Four Seasons. 


