A SEASON OF PICASSO

PICASSO: LATE ETCHINGS

Picasso was in his late eighties when he began an extraordinarily active period of printmaking. This exhibition comprises two suites each of twelve etchings.

THE MAGNIFICENT CUCKOLD is a farce by Crommelynck, whom Picasso knew. In these illustrations the characters are informed by his personal mythology: horned beasts and man-bulls.

THE BURIAL OF COUNT ORGAZ is a painting by El Greco which Picasso always admired when young. In these he revives memories from his Andalusian childhood.

PICASSO: HISTOIRE NATURELLE

These prints are considered by many to be one of Picasso's most important graphic works. In them the artist depicts animals, insects, birds, domestic and wild animals.

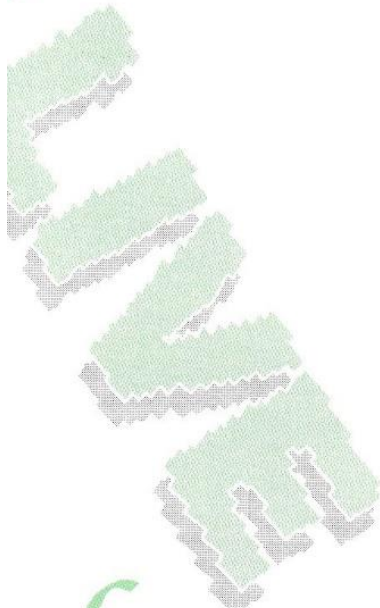
