(Manchester) Band, a Henry Moore Exhibition and an exhibition of Rembrandt reproductions.

BALLETS

Founded by Edward Gaillard and now entering their fifteenth season, the Ballets Minerva have been the pioneers of touring ballet in the provinces. Since the company was formed in 1954, it has remained the policy to present the best in classical and modern ballet; in order to provide entertainment and pleasure for audiences all over the country. On this occasion, the company will be performing classical excerpts from "Les Sylphides" (Music by Chopin and Choreography by Fokine), together with the dramatic ballet "Manfred", one of the company's most successful creations, danced to the Tchaikowsky symphony and based on Byron's dramatic poem a study of the search of modern man for peace of mind and happiness.

RECITAL

LEON GOOSSENS "The Oboe Family

Leon Goossens, the greatest of living oboe players, was born and educated in Liverpool. At the age of sixteen, he was appointed principal oboe of the Queen's Hall Orchestra by Sir Henry Wood. Later, Goossens decided to concentrate entirely on solo work, and it is as a soloist that his true greatness showed itself. His rapid tonguing and fluent fingerwork enlarged the technical possibilities of the instrument: he refined the previously broad, harsh tone into the beautiful pure round sound so distinctive of the oboe today. A whole repertoire has been built



around this one artist by such composers as Strauss, Hindemith, Gordon Jacob, Vaughan Williams and Britten. In 1949, Leon Goossens received the C.B.E. for his services to music. He comes to the Mid-Pennine area immediately prior to appearing at the Bath Festival.

IMAGE OF HISTORY

63 years of British Press Photography, an exhibition by Ilford Limited. The pictures, from Queen Victoria in 1900 to Marilyn Rice-Davies in 1963 via Crippen, Mrs Emmeline Pankhurst and two World Wars, were selected by the Press Committee of the Institute of Incorporated Photographers as outstanding examples of British press photography in the 20th century. The exhibition has been seen in London, Copenhagen, Milan, Amsterdam, Hong Kong, New York, Washington, Switzerland, Australia, New Zealand and South Africa.

DAVID WILD: "An exhibition of paintings and drawings, with an evening of nonbrow presentation by some local people

David Wild writes: The paintings have been produced over the last twelve years. Their concern has been the nature of appearance; latterly, appearance has served at best to suggest "being." Without the advantage of the malleability of oil paint, the drawings attempt to deal with the same problem. The evening's entertainment will be to the accompaniment of the paintings, and like them will be styleless. Incompatibility of cultural idiom will form a basis for a respectable programme of music and words exhaled by some local people.
