National Crafts Exhibition 1973

14 March to 29 April

The Crafts Advisory Committee is planning a National Crafts Exhibition to be shown at the Victoria and Albert Museum in April 1973, and a selection of the exhibits will go to the Royal Scottish Museum, Edinburgh, for showing in the Autumn at the time of the Festival, From the London exhibition it is hoped to choose the craft items to represent Great Britain at the World Crafts Exhibition in Toronto during the Summer of 1974.

The aim of the exhibition is to generate a greater public awareness in creative crafts and to show their relation and value to contemporary society. This will require work of the highest standard, and while we appreciate that time is short, we think this will be a unique opportunity for artist-craftsmen.

So as to get the widest possible coverage, selection will be done by a two-tier system-there will be a series of regional selection meetings during November and December this year, and a final national selection to choose the 400-500 exhibits early in 1973. The selectors will be looking for outstanding examples of creativity in design as well as the highest standards of workmanship and skill.

To ensure that no-one is overlooked we would ask you to help us by bringing to the attention of the practising craftsmen the fact that this exhibition is to be held, and by encouraging them to participate.


Burnley Schools' Theatre Group





Mid-Pennine Centre for the Arts

It has always been the policy of the MPAA to work toward the establishment of a Centre for the Arts in North East Lancashire. We are now able to move closer to the realisation of this scheme, as the site earmarked for the building is already partly clear. So that building may start as soon as the site is available, detailed plans of the theatre as the core of the building have already been prepared, providing for a very flexible theatre to house plays, ballet, opera, concerts and many other activities. Around this central core will be provision for other leisure pursuits such as painting, ceramics, photography and film, as well as meeting rooms and a rehearsal studio. There will of course, be a coffee bar, licensed bar and restaurant, so that those using the building can be refreshed by a meal before the theatre, or a cup of coffee and a chat with a friend during a mornings shopping.

The Centre will be for everyone's enjoyment. Open every day from 10 am, it will provide opportunities for discovering more about the arts, for taking part in arts activities.
