SCULPTURE OUTDOORS 69 is the development of the 1968 exhibition of sculpture in the open by the Rochdale Sculptors. Once again, the Rochdale Sculptors are very well represented (exhibits 1 to 18 inclusive); but this year we have also invited a number of other sculptors, all of whom live and work in the north of England, to contribute to the exhibition.

Rochdale Sculptors In 1967, a group of artists living and teaching in Rochdale formed a group with the aim of promoting street exhibitions of sculpture and thus of presenting contemporary sculpture to the ordinary man. The first exhibition by the Rochdale Sculptors was in Rochdale town centre in September 1968; and this was later seen in Haworth Park, Accrington, and in Southport. They have recently staged another exhibition on the Esplanade, Rochdale, and some of the artists had works in the Gwynedd 69 exhibition at Caernarvon, to coincide with the Investiture of the Prince of Wales. In 1970, they plan to mount two street exhibitions in Germany.

It is hoped that SCULPTURE OUTDOORS 69 may itself lead on to the establishment of an annual open exhibition for northern sculptors at the Haworth Art Gallery, and we shall be pleased to hear from private and industrial patrons who would like to assist in the sponsorship of such a venture by offering, or contributing towards, purchase prizes.
