#### \* OIL PAINTINGS by KATHLEEN BARRETT 10 to 29 September

Real and fantastic subjects combined are the essential feature of the paintings of Kathleen Barrett. Her work is symbolic but also almost humoresque, with a haunting romanticism and pathos. The swirling motions of her style fill and animate the entire canvas in a wide variety of different subjects. Currently painting in Chicago, Kathleen has frequently visited Europe, and has participated in the Edinburgh Festival each year since 1981.

#### \* DEBORAH FLADGATE: GLASSWARE 3 to 29 September

Hand-blown glass by Deborah Fladgate includes individual pieces, vases, bowls, plates, wine glasses, tumblers and paperweights. Commissions and special orders can be undertaken – and her work is well worth a look. Her output has a very quiet, classic simplicity: black vases which you'd expect to be made of ceramic, but never glass, and softer colour combinations with matt surfaces. See cover illustration.

#### \* DANCE DRAWINGS by CHARLOTTE FAWLEY 1 to 27 October

Charlotte Fawley's varied career has included work in advertising (including the Manchester Guardian), book illustration and more recently television.

The drawings in our present exhibition reflect Charlotte's life-long interest in dance and ballet. These latest drawings set out to capture some of the pure magic of the fleeting moments of dance, and include watercolours and ink drawings of leading ballet dancers and the contemporary black dancers of Charles Augins' group Massai. Lively spontaneity and fluidity of line to complement MPAA's various Danceabout NW events.

### \* 'BIRD BOWLS' and other items in carved wood by Michael & Liz O'Donnell

#### 1 to 27 October

Michael O'Donnell has been working in wood for over ten years, but has only relatively recently started to develop ideas using the green wood technique. Using tulipwood, holly, elm, laurel and beech, he produces beautifully turned bowls, often with the bark still attached in places, and so thin that they are translucent. A particular, unique, speciality are the 'Bird Bowls' turned by Michael and then carved and decorated with delicate bird motifs by Liz. Exquisite and eminently collectable!

#### CHARLIE MEECHAM 'Passages of Time' 29 October to 24 November

1984 – Heritage Year – has been marked by a special MPAA commission from photographer Charlie Meecham. Passages of Time explores, through colour photography, the layering of history upon the landscape of North-East Lancashire. The theme includes the lines of communication, the pathways, trackways, canal, rail and trade routes, which give this area such a distinctive flavour. 
#### \* CRAFTS AT CHRISTMAS 26 November to 22 December


