


THEATREMOBILE

TheatreMobile is the peripatetic professional theatre company attached to the Mid-Pennine Association for the Arts. The company consists of 8 actors, 4 technicians, a musician/composer, a designer, an administrative assistant and the Artistic Director. The theatre company is a selfcontained unit carrying its own acting area, sound and lighting equipment. The equipment is transported in a 3 ton wagon and the personnel travel in a mini bus. We have office facilities in the MPAA premises in Burnley. At present we rehearse in a disused church where conditions are rather primitive. However, both the Church and the separate Sunday School building have been granted planning permission, following an application by TheatreMobile, for conversion into a permanent rehearsal base and community centre.



TheatreMobile was set up by the MPAA in 1970 because of the lack of professional theatre in the Mid-Pennine region and the company's brief is to stimulate an interest for theatre in an area which would otherwise be deprived of experiencing 'live' professional theatre. TheatreMobile's productions are toured to the districts which are members of the Mid-Pennine Association and performed in the facilities which exist there for public entertainment e.g. town halls, schools, civic centres. Occasionally short visits outside the area are arranged, usually as part of a festival.

TheatreMobile's work covers all age ranges from 5—105's. The company works with children as performers, not as a theatre-in-education group. The children's programmes are devised by the Artistic Director with the company and include a large amount of audience participation.

For older age ranges the company presents established plays of quality, both classic and modern texts. Also there are programmes compiled for specific occasions — for fairs, fetes, festivals, to take into pubs, old peoples homes, handicapped centres, etc. The programme from April, 1974 to April, 1975 includes performances of

In addition, Gloria Parkinson, Artistic Director of TheatreMobile, directed a film *Heaven Starts Here* Easter 1974, in which 100 local teenagers recorded their impression of life in the Mid-Pennine region. Other members of the company assisted on this production.

Obviously such a wide ranging programme makes heavy demands on the versatility of the company. Without a theatre building or accepted set decor the company exists on the talent of its members. Simply to be a good conventional actor is not enough, with the company he must develop allround skills as an entertainer, play musical instruments, perform acrobatics, learn dance, mime, juggling, magic, etc.

TheatreMobile is one of several peripatetic companies operating in the areas of England where no other professional theatre activity is readily accessible. These companies are an important development in theatre in recent years and provide an exciting alternative to the more formal system of repertory theatres.


