

Canal 2000

We have a series of spectacular events lined up for this unique year-long festival, Canal 2000. Canal 2000, or C2K, celebrates East Lancashire's waterway - the 25-mile stretch of the Leeds and Liverpool Canal that runs from Barnoldswick to Blackburn. C2K has been coordinated by Mid Pennine Arts with the aim of contributing to the regeneration of the Canal and its communities through the arts - and it links four districts, fourteen neighbourhoods and numerous partner organisations.

Throughout the year, local communities and school children are taking part in a wide range of projects with a canal theme and, from Easter to October, a packed programme of events and activities will take place on and along the Canal for local people and visitors alike.

A focal point for the celebrations is British Waterways Canal boat Kennet, which will travel the length of the Canal and act as a floating studio for hands-on activities including music, photography, poetry, story-telling and much more.



The Launch

The C2K celebrations were kick started with an Easter weekend launch at four key venues that included a boat parade, music, performance, and dazzling firework displays.

Paul Rooney's series of video tableaux, 'At a Distance from' explores the sense of exclusion experienced by people who exist at the so-called centre of things yet remain peripheral, at a distance from. In 'Lost from Sight', Sarah Carne uses sound and projected imagery to evoke a world of information made available through the written word, yet from which people with visual impairment are isolated.

'At a Distance' presents the national premiere of these two newly commissioned works, devised in response to the annual Burnley Blues Festival.



Prodigal Son New work by Mark Stonehouse 10th June - 22nd July

Made especially for the Mid Pennine Gallery, award winning RCA graduate Mark Stonehouse turns the world upside down in this highly original show.

Prodigal Son explores notions of return through ritual familiarisation. The viewer is given a vision that can free them from gravity. This creates a point of departure for the imagination – is the piece part of an ordnance survey or is it topography of a heavenly body?

The work seeks to explore ideas such as; Mass (blockage) versus Openness (movement) and will give the viewer opportunity to transpose and reappraise the values describing their own position in relation to themes expressed by the piece.

Shadow Chasers New work by Andrew Sneddon 29th July 16th September

'Shadow Chasers' presents an evocative and poetic body of new work by the Scottish-born artist, Andrew Sneddon that revolves around Middlewood Asylum, a large and derelict Victorian hospital on the outskirts of Sheffield.

Through his studies of the asylum and research into the historical and social implications of 'Institution', Sneddon has collated a series of powerful images that invokes themes of repetition and systems of order alongside notions of the individual being lost to the multiple.

Large scale photographs of the patients presents us with a moving portrait of a damaged humanity in the context of a decaying institution. In the midst of these images is installed a table tennis table with concrete bats. Much of the Middlewood patients' time was spent in occupational therapy: making concrete paving slabs for the council and fabricating table tennis bats. This table, ordinarily a symbol of leisure and recreation, is now transformed into one of enforced repetitive activity and segregation from the outside world.

'Shadow Chasers' is a Mid Pennine Arts touring exhibition and is accompanied by a fully illustrated catalogue, on sale in the Mid Pennine Gallery.

BuslifeArt on the move

Between June and November, and in association with Stagecoach Ribble, Mid Pennine Arts presents 'Buslife'.

'Buslife' is an exciting series of five artists residencies on selected Stagecoach buses operating throughout the Mid Pennine area. Bus passengers will be asked to contribute to work by some of the North West's most innovative artists. The resulting pieces will then be exhibited on the buses themselves, both internally and externally. For just the price of a bus ticket, you may find yourself in a moving art gallery.

'Buslife' commences proper in June with an exhibition of work by Michael Robertson that explores the Wild West connotations associated to the company name Stagecoach and invents a fictional, digitally created frontier town. In July, and following her recent exhibition at the Mid Pennine Gallery, Sarah Carne will be presenting photographic portraits of bus passengers that explore the fantasy world into which they retreat whilst travelling by bus. In August, Julie Chow Ping Fu creates a series of comic strips that relay the past experiences of people from other cultures in travelling by bus.

The residencies continue in September and October with artists, Bashir Makhoul and Paul Rooney so, watch this space.

During the summer, and as part of the C2K millennium celebrations, MPA have commissioned the production of a major video installation by TEA called 'The Cut' that explores the 25-mile stretch of Leeds/Liverpool Canal upon which the C2K festivities are based.

Tea (Those Environmental Artists) are a pioneering group of four artists whose work seeks to examine social networks not usually made visible. Previous projects by Tea have included 'Other Peoples Shoes' in Rossendale, 'By the Way' for Transpennine Arts and 'Looking Both Ways' at the Royal Liver Building, Liverpool.

Full details of 'The Cut' may be found in the C2K brochure. To assist in the project's realisation and presentation, however, MPA are seeking a trainee with an interest in the contemporary visual arts and some experience either as practitioner or organiser.

The traineeship will encompass 10 days of work over the summer period. Applicants must be over 21 and possess a clean driving licence as the work may involve travelling throughout East Lancashire. 

Brierfield Arts Project

In partnership with Groundwork East Lancs, Mid-Pennine Arts have just appointed Marie Davies as Arts and Cultural Officer for Brierfield. This new initiative for the Pendle area aims to build a programme of community and environmental arts work on a neighbourhood basis.

Marie will work from a base in Brierfield, alongside Community and Economic Development Workers and project workers from Groundwork East Lancs. The whole team are working towards a better future for the Brierfield area and surrounding neighbourhoods.

Helping create a Mela for Nelson, set for 19th August


