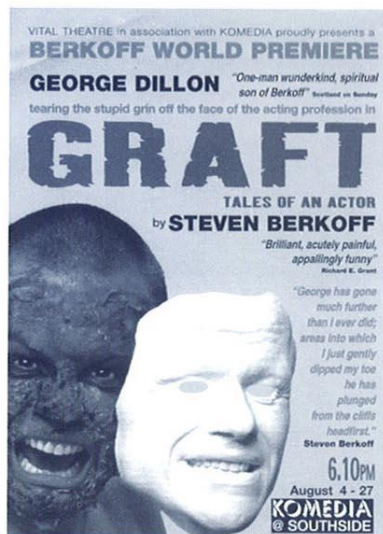

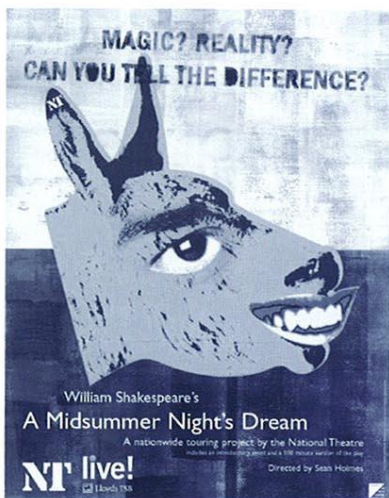

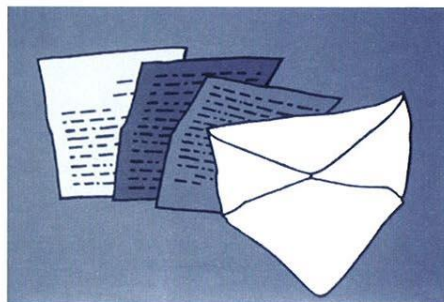
pop prints

Andy Warhol's 'Jackie', Richard Hamilton's 'My Marilyn', Peter Blake's 'Beach Boys' and Roy Lichtenstein's 'Reverie' are included as well as works by Patrick Caulfield, Jim Dine, David Hockney, Eduardo Paolozzi, Robert Rauschenberg, Colin Self, Joe Tilson and Tom Wesselmann.

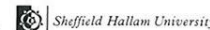
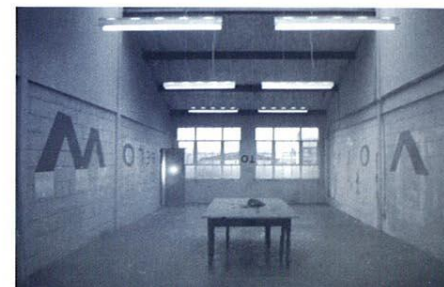
'On Vanishing' presents new photographic work by the collaborative artists, Steve Dutton and Percy Peacock, and is inspired by George Sluizer's iconic film, 'The Vanishing'. Dutton & Peacock's work frequently explores the idea of photography as premonition. Through strategies of repetition, inversion, rotation, the use of archetypes and enlargement, the artists encourage the audience to somehow already know a photograph or a piece of film. Strangely significant objects or scenarios draw us in to these images, compel us to attempt to decipher ambiguous codes and leave us with a sense of disquiet, thoughts of apocalypse.

'On Vanishing' has been organised in collaboration with Site Gallery and is supported by Sheffield Hallam University and Yorkshire Arts. The exhibition is associated by a fully illustrated catalogue, on sale in the Mid Pennine Gallery.

off the record: black and blue
Philip Jeck

14th April - 26th May

This extraordinary installation by Liverpool-based visual and performance artist, Philip Jeck, comes to the Mid Pennine Gallery following its recent inclusion in the highly acclaimed 'Sonic Boom' exhibition at the Hayward Gallery last year.

Philip Jeck is an artist whose work stands at the forefront in the increasingly important field of sound art. Since the 1980s, Jeck's work has revolved around the use of record players. His installations and performances, comprising anything up to 200 players, have been included in many high profile exhibitions and festivals. The artist has also composed and performed musical scores for use in dance, theatre, on film and television and, most recently, over Bavarian Radio.

'Off the Record' is a continuous project for a fluctuating number of record players, adjusted to suit the space it temporarily inhabits. In celebration of the Burnley Blues Festival, Philip Jeck is giving the installation a specifically blues slant. Over sixty record players, painted black and blue, will be installed in the gallery and, operated by timers, will play a doctored collection of blues and blues-related records: a must-see for both music and art enthusiasts.

The exhibition of 'Off the Record' is a major coup for Burnley and Mid Pennine Arts and will show until 26th May. Over the Easter weekend, to

coincide with the Burnley Blues Festival, the gallery will extend its normal opening hours as follows:

You can gain an insight into six months of community and education workshops through an exhibition which will tour venues in Hyndburn, Pendle and Burnley during the new year.

Videos of artists working, photographs, pieces of art work from a weather vane to 'bog books', from shadow puppets to banners will show the range of work presented by school children, students and members of the communities in one of the most complex projects undertaken by Mid Pennine Arts. The climax of the C2K Festival was the evening of 2000 Candles when writer Alan Bennett joined 5000 people by the waterside.

graffiti



Continuing the success of C2K, working with British Waterways and the LCC Youth and Community Service, we hope to design a graffiti style mural for a local industrial, canalside venue.

This project forms part of Mid Pennine's long-term commitment to helping regenerate the canal through the arts. Young adults will work together with a Burnley based artist to create a dynamic design encouraging people not to turn their backs on the canal.

halle gamelan

Members of the Halle Orchestra will be offering two separate week long residencies in Pendle and Hyndburn to work with community groups and school-age children at the end of March and early April. Participants will be introduced to a range of Indonesian musical instruments and take part in hands-on music-making workshops leading to a performance at the end of the week.
