



### prierfield millennium peace



The Arts and Cultural project has been working in partnership supporting a group of young Asian men from the Brierfield Youth Centre in creating a Peace Garden in the centre of Brierfield.

Initiated by youth workers in 1998 after tensions between

rival groups of young men in the town boiled over, the Peace Garden was completed in April 2001. Working with artist Paul Hartley the group, from Brierfield Youth Centre, designed and made mosaic panels for the floor and painted a mural. Sculptor Clare Bigger worked to their design to create the and sculpture that now sits in the garden.

Philip Jeck's work stands at the forefront in the field of sound art. Since the 1980s, Jeck's work has revolved around record players. His installations and performances have been included in many high profile festivals and exhibitions.

'Off the Record' is a continuous project for a fluctuating number of record players, adjusted to suit the space it inhabits. For the Mid Pennine Gallery, Philip Jeck has given the installation a blues slant in celebration of Burnley Blues Festival.

Over sixty record players, painted black and blue, are operated by timers and play a doctored collection of blues and blues related records: a must-see for both music and art enthusiasts.

#### chiaroscuro:caroline Broadhead 2 june - 14 july

Chiaroscuro: the treatment of light and shade in a painting, drawing etc., so as to produce the illusion of depth. (Collins English Dictionary)




Caroline Broadhead is one of Britain's leading contemporary artists to have evolved a vocabulary out of clothing. Through investigating objects associated with the body, Broadhead has developed a visual discourse around ideas of the layers between self/other, inside/outside, material/immaterial. 'Chiaroscuro' is Broadhead's first solo exhibition in the North West. The show combines existing work with new pieces designed specifically for the Mid Pennine Gallery.

I propose to work with light and shade, continuing and developing ideas that I have been working on over the last few years. Using the garment and its shadow, there is an area of expectation, illusion and confusion that I will explore. Born in Leeds and living and working in London, Broadhead's objects and installations have been exhibited internationally and at UK venues including Angel Row, the Hayward Gallery, Ikon and Oriel Mostyn.

'Chiaroscuro' has a fully illustrated catalogue, launched by Mid Pennine Arts in association with the Barrett Marsden Gallery, London. It includes an essay by Victoria Pomery, Senior Curator at Tate Liverpool.

The publication and exhibition are supported by Middlesex University and North West Arts Board.

Tehmina Shah was born in Lahore and moved to London in the late eighties to study printmaking at the Chelsea School of Art. Shah now lives and works in London and her print-based work explores the diversity of cultural and environmental influences that have shaped her own life:

My intention is to involve the viewer in a creative process of constructing meaning. The sense of my story lies in ambiguity, in many layers, going back to early childhood fantasies and forward to many dreams and experiences as an adult.

Tehmina Shah's work has been presented at national and international level and the Croyden Clocktower, the Bluecoat Gallery, Liverpool and Cartwright Hall, Bradford. She was also

represented in 'Pakistan: Another Vision', a major 50 year retrospective of painting and sculpture from Pakistan that toured Britain last year.



The Forest of Burnley is a three-year project funded by the Millennium Commission, aiming to change the landscape of Burnley for generations to come, improve quality of life and create pride in the area. By regenerating 90 hectares of woodland and planting 500 hectares of new community woodland, the Forest will conserve wildlife habitats close to town and provide an educational and recreational resource.



From October 2001 to March 2002, there will be a series of artist-led education and community workshops on an environmental theme in the Forest of Burnley. Sculptors, crafts workers, actors, musicians and storytellers will work with local schools and community groups to encourage use of the Forest sites and help improve disabled access.


