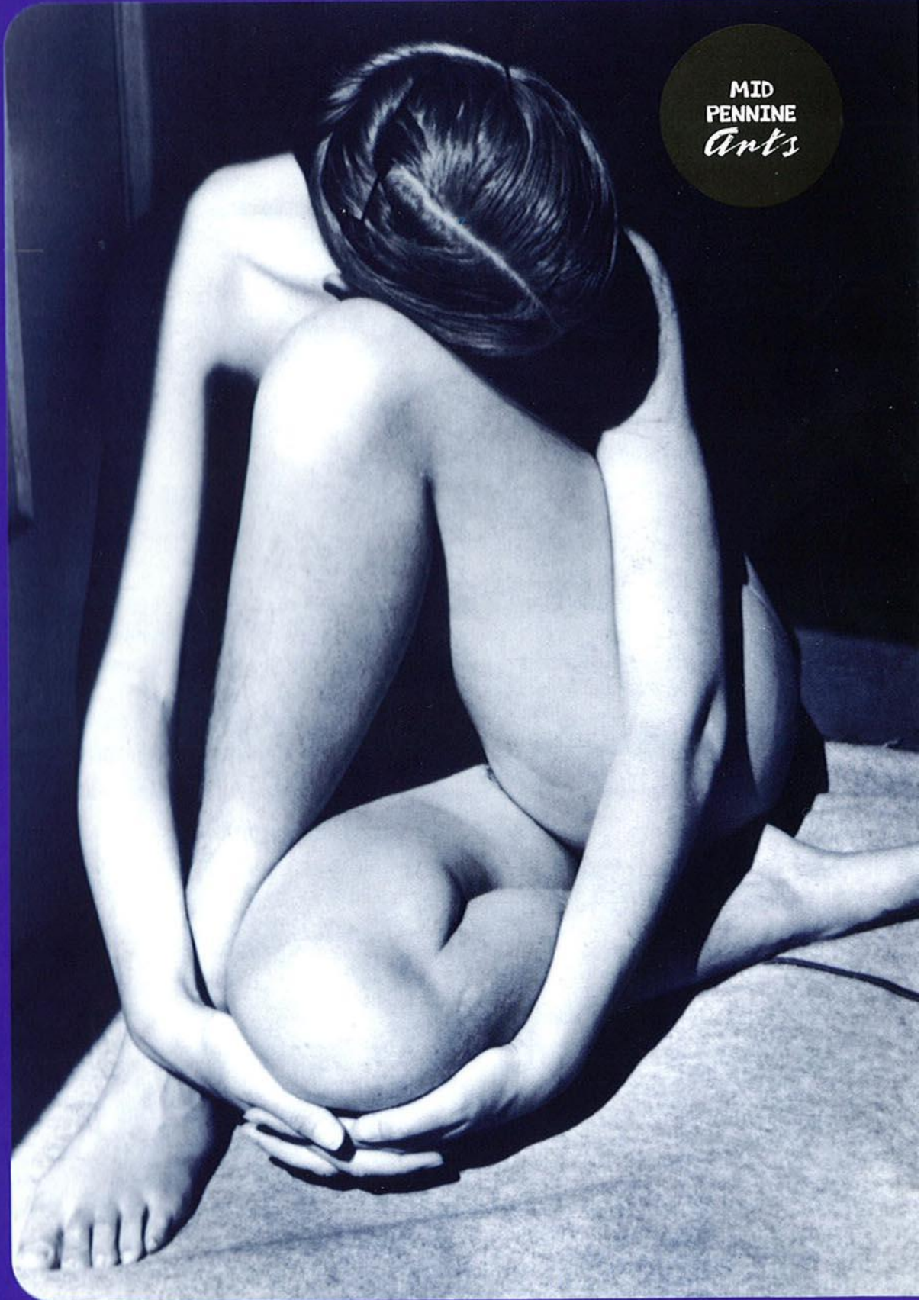
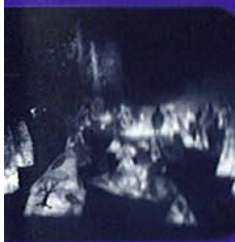

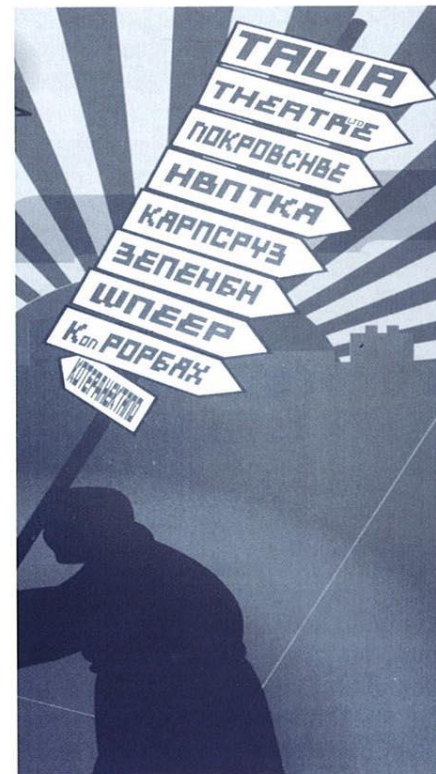

## Edward Weston

12 January- 9 February

The American photographer, Edward Weston (1886-1958) is one of the masters of modernist photography.

This exhibition from the Arts Council Collection consists of 24 photographs printed from the original negatives and covering the full range of Weston's subjects- from nudes and portraits to still life and landscape. They date from the 1920's when Weston's style changed, *combining a maximum of detail with a maximum of simplification.*

Many of these images are classics of 20th century photography. They retain a clarity and freshness undiminished since the moment of their making.

## Martin Vincent

### "Driving is the Same as Walking"

16 February – 1 April

Martin Vincent is one of the foremost artists living and working in Manchester. His works have been exhibited



in traditional and alternative spaces, nationally and internationally.

Shows include *Record Collection* at VTO Gallery, London and Forde Gallery, Geneva (2001), *You Are Here* at Manchester Metropolitan University Gallery (2000) and The Cab Gallery at numerous venues. As co-director of Manchester's Annual Programme, he participated in the acclaimed *Manchester Pavilion*, at the Venice Biennale (2001) and featured in *Century City* at Tate Modern (2001).

For Mid Pennine Gallery, Martin Vincent focuses on one aspect of his practice, presenting recent work unified in its reflection of his fascination with the peripheries and banalities of fame.

**Driving is the Same as Walking** includes a series of works which identify insignificant moments in rock history that have, become iconic- such as Elvis's one and only half hour on British soil or Gary Numan's plane crash. In another series, lyrics are printed onto

music manuscript paper and embrace the all-encompassing yet wholly reductive tendencies of pop music in covering subjects including Hitler, King Kong, Marx and God.



This exhibition promises to be a highlight of Mid Pennine Gallery's Spring programme and will be associated by an artist-designed web page, [www.lifeisgood2002.net](http://www.lifeisgood2002.net)

The show provides a fitting context to launch the **Burnley Blues Festival** on Friday 29 March. Mid Pennine Gallery will extend its opening hours over Easter to join the festivities.

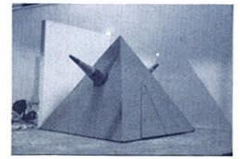

## Alex Baker New Work 13 April – 1 June



Alex Baker recreates things, .....

*...that do things, things that think A context is interrupted, something else is displaced. All the while, simple things come together to make complex things. These are all machines, emotional structures. Where truth is lost and questions become pointless, faith remains: faith in the possibility of the impossible or just faith in the little things that make the day go by.*



Alex Baker graduated from the Slade in 2001. His final work, *Movement in D Minor* became a highlight of the degree show –also shown at the Jerwood Gallery and Leeds Metropolitan University Gallery.

*Movement in D Minor* comprised a chain of speakers that followed the architectural structure of the environment in which it was placed, and the human movements that occurred within it, via its connection to a keyboard.

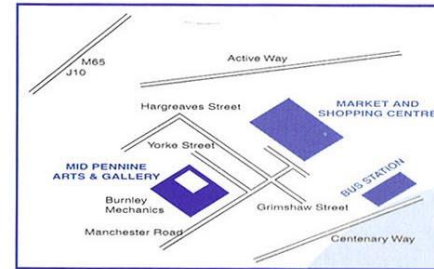
