SPOrTLIGHT

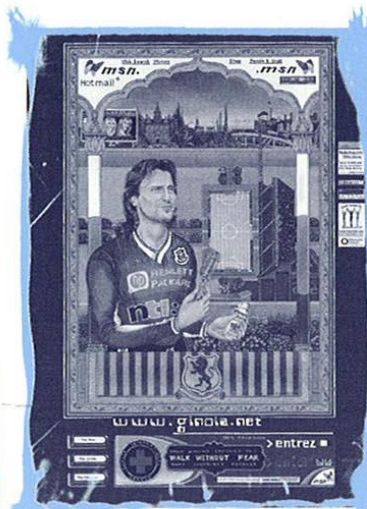
8 June – 20 July

Rebrindra and Amrit Singh are two of the most acclaimed artists working in the North West. Their paintings provide contemporary reinterpretations of traditional Indian miniature painting.

For Mid Pennine Gallery, the Singh Twins have created symbolic portraits of sports celebrities such as David Beckham, David Ginola, Mohammed Ali, Prince Naseem, Torvill & Dean and Tyson & Eubank. The exhibition provides a satirical look at the changing nature of sport and sportsmanship and the influence of mass media and commercialism.

'SPOrTLIGHT' is a fitting lead into the Commonwealth Games and an amusing comment upon the brouhaha with which they are surrounded. Anyone interested in sport, sports personalities and the nature of fame will love these portraits with a twist.

The exhibition opens on **Saturday 8 June** with live music and a selection of refreshments of a suitably multicultural taste.

MASAKATSO KONDO

27 July – 7 September

The work of Japan born Masakatsu Kondo exists in the hinterland between the natural and the artificial, the representational and the abstract, the broadly traditional and the utterly contemporary.

His often massive paintings are not photoreal but hyperreal: the products of a highly selective process of editing and amplification aimed at jolting us out of habitual ways of looking. His landscapes are not drawn from life but instead from geology books and gardening magazines, imaging not the reality of the natural world but our idealised and stereotypical notions of how it might or should exist.



Masakatsu Kondo was prize winner of the Young Contemporaries in 1993 after graduating from the Slade School of Fine Arts. His work has been shown at venues including the Wetterling Gallery in Stockholm, the Zwemmer Gallery in Lindon and the Kohi Ogura Gallery in his birthplace, Nagoya.

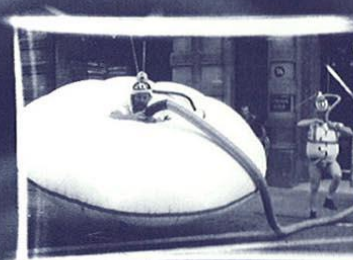

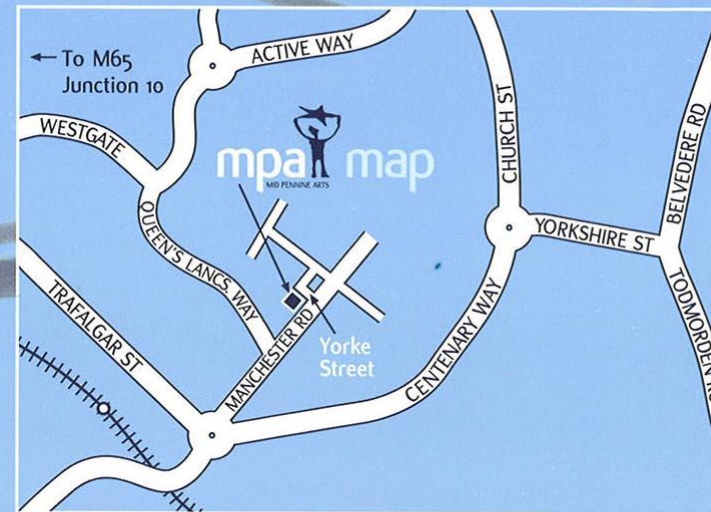

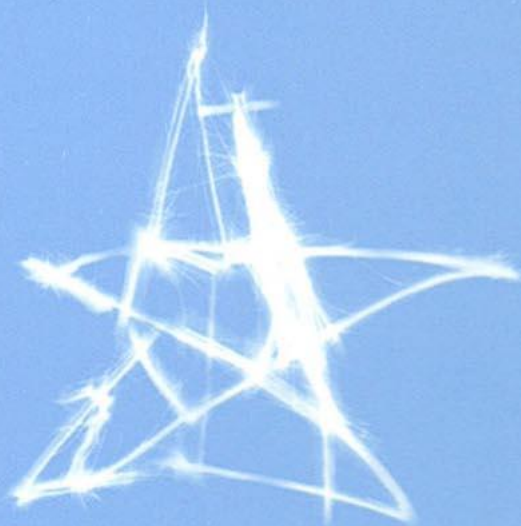
