The ever popular Blues Boat is back at Burnley Blues Festival in April.



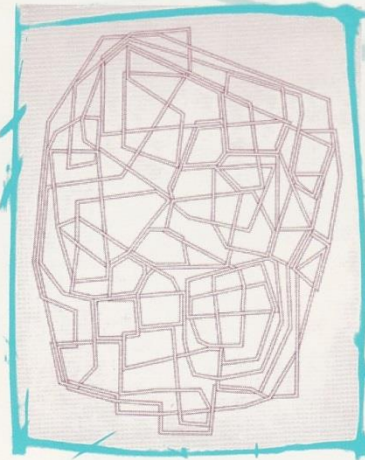
## KENNETH MARTIN

#### Publication Launch in April

Elders of the Brierfield Community are currently being interviewed and their memories of the social and physical changes to the area documented.

Writer Mandy Precious will use the interviews as the basis for a publication in English and Urdu to be distributed around East Lancashire.

In 2002 she chatted to and interviewed elders of the white community at an evening at Walter Street Social Club and during seven individual home visits.

2003 starts with more interviews with Mandy (and a translator) capturing the recollections of elders of the Asian community.

All material and interviews have been recorded as the start of a social history archive for Brierfield.

Sessions are every: Thursday for 12 weeks 10–11.30 am. St Mary's Parish Centre, Whitefield. Starts Thursday 30 January.



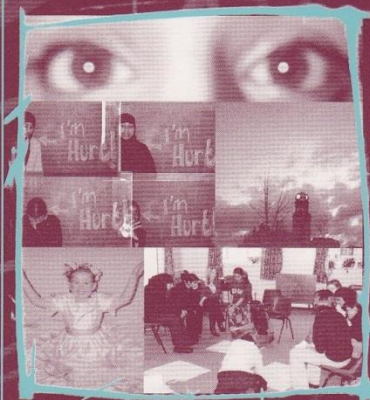
## NEW COMMUNITY GROUP

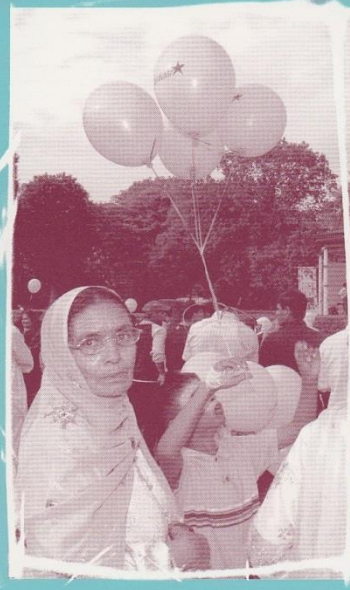

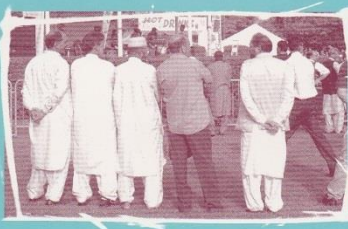
