The first partnership project has taken place. Writer Alan Brown and Willow artist Geoff Allen's work has culminated in willow screens with designs inspired by children's poems and willow radling around the water's edge.

Throughout Spring, designer and craftsman Eliot Baron and musician Leo Nolan will collaborate on creating a large timber frame multi sensory installation and stage area with carvings inspired by local children. 
## KENNETH MARTIN


