

As well as the development of a second full time education post and receiving a Creativity Works Award for our literacy programme (which continued with Kicking Leaves Festival in the Autumn Term), we have also been fortunate enough to work closely with our two Creative Partnership 'Hub' Schools, Whitefield Infants and Haslingden High School and deliver a consistently high quality programme of work across East Lancashire schools which included over 170 artist days in schools and many successful events for Teachers' Professional Development.

### Kicking Leaves Writing Competition

The competition is open to children from the East Lancashire boroughs of Burnley, Hyndburn, Pendle, Ribble Valley, Rossendale and Todmorden, working at both Key Stages 1 & 2.

Winners will receive book tokens and certificates to celebrate their achievement and will see their work published in a professionally designed collection of children's writing. Their writing will be published



alongside a specially commissioned story for the children of East Lancashire by the children's writer David Almond, author of: 'Skellig', 'Wild Boy, Wild Girl', Secret Heart', and most recently 'Clay' published by Hodder.

Poems and stories of any length and any subject, written between August 2006 and January 31st 2007, may be submitted. Only one entry per pupil should be entered. Each entry should include the pupil's name, age, Key Stage, and the name of the School. A copy of each child's entry should be kept by the pupil because it will not be possible to return individual pieces of work entered for the competition.
