

Teacher Forum Hundertwasser & Vienna KS 1 & 2

During the Autumn half term, a party of eight teachers and support teachers from Whitefield Infants' School were joined by Hannah Kidd to explore the work of artist, Friedensreich Hundertwasser on his home ground of Vienna. Although known as a painter, he is perhaps better known for his work in architectural design. He had a particular interest in exploring the relationship between buildings and ecology; so trees and plantings are very much a part of his design.

The teacher forum will be an opportunity to find out more about the artist and ways in which the staff at Whitefield Infants have used his work to inspire their wider curriculum.

Todmorden Schools Tour: Dhamak Dhol Drumming

Nine Primary Schools in Todmorden are being treated to a half day visit from two members of Dhamak who will be giving the whole school a performance of Indian Dhol Drumming introducing them to the instruments and the traditions behind the music. They will then spend an hour with a single class who developing their percussion skills.

This is an annual series of workshops fiunded by Todmorden Town Council as a gift to the local schools. The workshops will be taking place during January and February.



Creative Partnerships

Manchester Art Gallery

Start 08 is our third annual exhibition dedicated to student art work from secondrary schools across East Lancashire. Mid Pennine Arts has given students the opportunity to show their work in a professional gallery, the work mounted and framed as a professional artist would. The work will be selected on 21st January by North West Artist, Andrew Bracey; Schools and Colleges Manager for Manchester Art Gallery, Joanne Davies; staff at Mid Pennine Arts and two students from Blessed Trinity College, Burnley.

Alongside the exhibition, Mid Pennine Arts will be hosting a series of workshops for both secondary school, and primary school pupils and also a Teacher Twilight.

Helen Callaghan Visual Artist KS 2

Helen will be exploring different aspects of the STart exhibition, using it as inspiration for pupils to produce a series of relief plaster casts. Pupils will use clay to produce a negative mold into which casting plaster will be poured producing the finished work. This is an exciting opportunity for pupils to develop their interpretation of the exhibition using 3D media.

Alan Birch Printmaker For KS 2

Using work in the exhibition, primary pupils will produce a series of drawings and prints which reflect the creative potential of print.

Pupils will be working with metallic card creating their own pencil drawings. These will then be transferred to





card plates, engraved, inked and printed. They will also explore Relief printing, using textured wallpaper and papers and mono printing using water based inks.

For KS 3 or 4

Students will look at the Alan's current exhibition 'Disasters of War'. Looking at the prints, they will be introduced to the creative possibilities of metallic card printing. Pupils will choose a news story from which they will produce an illustration which captures the essence of the story. This drawing will be transferred to card plates using sandpaper and nails. Pupils will ink and print their own plates.

Alan Birch Printmaker Teacher Twilight

We are delighted to offer this session to teachers as part of our STart '08 Exhibition. Alan will be discussing his work and current exhibition as well as offering a hands on workshop in Metallic Card Printing, Relief Printing and Mono Printing.

Alan Birch's 'Disaster of War' Exhibition will be on show at the Mid Pennine Gallery from 12th January to 23rd February.

For this exhibition Alan has taken his inspiration from Goya's prints from 1810 - 1814, which were based on the Peninsular War, and created a series which is 21st century reflection on modern warfare. Birch has retained Goya's original titles and image sizes, using them to record and document the period from September 11th 2001 to the present day.

Artist Profile:

Alan Birch Printmaker



Alan Birch is a printmaker with over 15 years experience working in schools, galleries and creative organisations. He is the print specialist at the Whitworth Art Gallery in Manchester. He is based at Prospect Studios in Waterfoot where he runs regular printmaking workshops. In 2007 the studio won the Creative Space Award East Lancashire from Creativity Works. Over the past three years he has worked on many projects for Creative Partnerships Manchester and Salford and East Lancashire.

He offers a programme of workshops for all year groups from primary to secondary and has also worked with AS and A Level students and adult groups. He has also run inservice training days for teachers in Manchester, Salford and Liverpool. The workshops using specialist water-based printing inks and a portable printing press provide participants with the opportunity to generate drawings, explore the printmaking process, create their own plates and print their final piece. The sessions can be tailored to suit particular themes and can explore dry point printing, relief, collograph and mono printing. Sessions can also be linked to his personal work or can be used to explore school based themes as part of coursework.

Pendle Schools Projects; working as Producer for Creative Partnerships!

Mid Pennine Arts has been delighted to work closely with Creative Partnerships since it arrived in East Lancashire in 2004. This term we find ourselves in a really exciting time, working with 10 primary schools in Pendle borough alone developing projects which look at cross curricular projects using the arts to explore literacy and science.

Barrowford Primary

French culture and language will be brought to life as a launch to the French curriculum. The project will involve the whole school working with a musician to develop a selection of French songs; as well as individual classes working more closely with a drama worker, textile artist and visual artist to explore french culture and language. The work which will take place largely in the second half of term, will culminate in a French celebration week.

Castercliff Primary, Nelson

Numeracy is the challenge for a group of artists working in the School during Spring. Artist Talya Rochester will work alongside children to create a 'maths trail' and Kjartan Poskitt, writer and creator of the best selling 'Murderous Maths' series will work on a 6 week e-mail exchange. With the younger children, ceramic artist Julie Miles will work on tessellation to produce pieces for the school garden whilst poet Terry Caffrey will create number rhymes to

Holy Saviour CE Primary, Nelson

Four artists will be working with children this term to create a 'Trail of Music' in the school grounds. Pupils will create outdoor musical instruments on which they can play and make music. They will also create sculptural pieces along the trail and work with a professional poet so that they can respond to their experience of the trail in poetry as well as music.

Sacred Heart RC Primary, Colne

Children from all years will be 'probing the heart of literacy' during the spring term. Poet Terry Caffrey will enjoy a ten week residency in the School with his work supported by a 6 week e-mail link with writer Alan Gibbons and visit from writer David Webb. Illustrator Steve Hutton will develop storyboarding techniques through illustration whilst artist Patricia Ramsden will work with staff on techniques for 'visualising' children's writing. Throughout this period children will enjoy visits by staff from Nelson Library in a project called: 'Bite-sized Reading'!

Salterforth Primary, in partnership with Kelbrook Primary, Earby Springfield Primary, Blacko Primary & St Joseph's Primary, Barnoldswick

This cluster of schools will be working to develop their scheme of work for gifted and talented pupils by taking a group of Year 4 children and a member of staff from each school on a three day residential working with artist, Julie Miles. Julie will also work with the group and staff either side of the residential so that the learning can be embedded into the ongoing work of the schools. The aim of the project will not only be to develop the pupils understanding of their learning needs but will also be used to develop skills both of the staff closely involved and also the wider schools.

Whitefield Infants, Nelson

The School will continue work on a major project this term based on an exploration of the question: 'How do things work?' Children in Reception will continue a 10 week programme working with drama worker Thea Soltau. Thea will set children problems which are to be solved through the creation of role play situations which can be developed further by teachers in the School in following terms. Year 1, after a visit to see Raymond Briggs play, 'The Snowman', will work with artist Kerris Casey St. Pierre to create a shadow puppet play and performance in school supported by a dancer. At the same time Year 2 pupils will work with technologist Ken Earith and apprentices from Rolls Royce to develop technology & science skills in exploring 'forces' to making objects which move!
