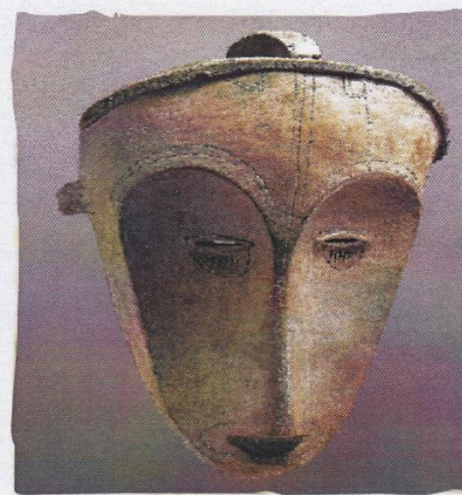
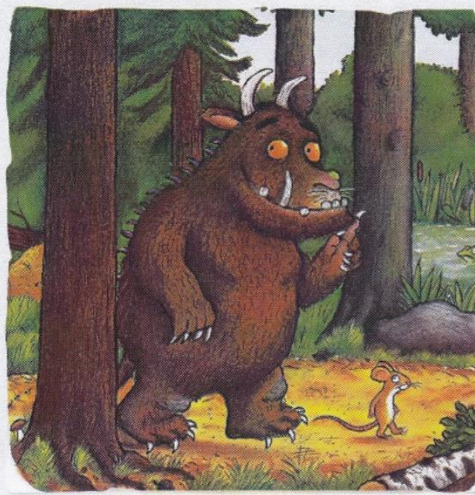
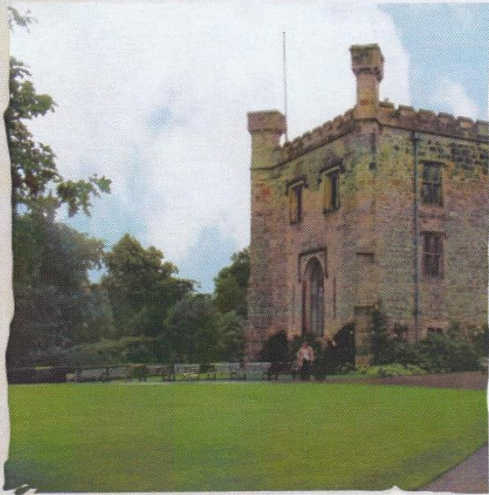

Although most famous for *The Gruffalo* (which was screened by the BBC over Christmas),

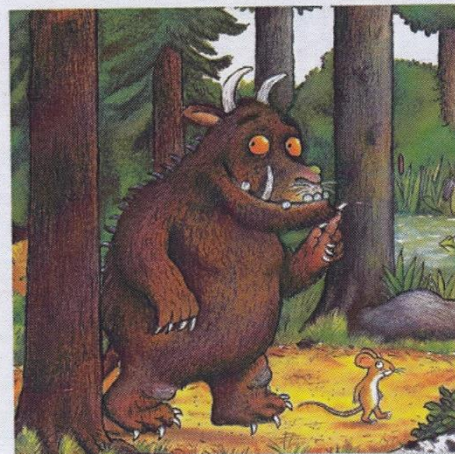

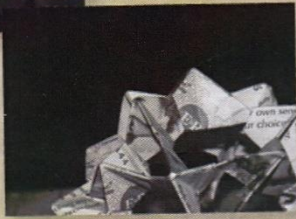

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Paper Sculpture with Pippa Pixley

This one day workshop provides an introduction to the exciting artform of paper engineering. From origami to pop-up books Pippa will introduce your students to storytelling in 3D.

Following the development of story themes, Pippa will help pupils create a mini booklet using pop-up or origami features to compliment their written text.

At the end of the session pupils will

have time to share their creations and to think up some wild and wacky future projects. A short 'blurb' for the back of their books will promote their work and appraise the session.

Ice Sculpture with Kirsty Mason

So successful were Kirsty's workshops last term - we are offering a second chance to book one for your school. Textile artist Kirsty will lead a one day workshop based on the theme of 'Ice' where children will explore and investigate patterns found in ice with hand held lenses. They will then produce observational studies of the patterns and recreate these through print. Next they will construct individual 'ice blocks' which will be brought together to form part of a class sculpture for the school. Finally the children will create an 'ice discovery book' to hold their investigations and thoughts.

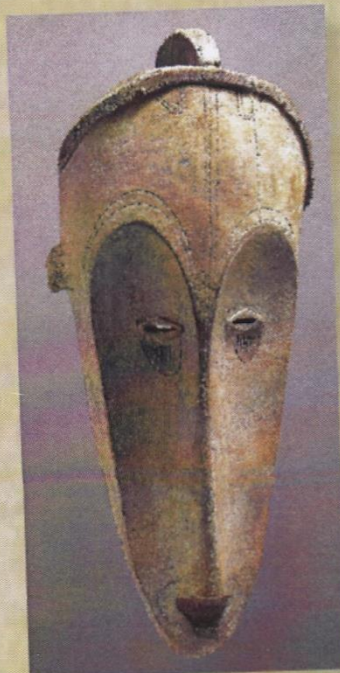
