'Inspiring Boys to Write' with poet David Harmer.

Mid Pennine Arts has been managing a literacy project on the theme of 'Inspiring Boys' to Write' for a cluster of 7 'small' schools across East Lancashire. Each school has been visited by two writers who have targeted Year 4 for the work. The climax of the project is a twilight course for the 60 teachers from the schools in the Great Barn at Gawthorpe Hall, Padiham on September 4th.

A very practical one day course to reflect the vital role that creative writing plays in the National Literacy Strategy. The aims of the day will be:

- to ensure teachers are more confident about using poetry in the classroom

Mid Pennine Arts is delighted to have secured John Foster as leader for this course. He is not only a prolific writer of books and poetry anthologies for children but has also written English course and source books which include Oxford Reading Tree tities. In addition to his writing, John is a former teacher with over 20 years experience who has played an active role in promoting good English teaching in schools. Working with some of the country's top poets, his anthologies present children with original, contemporary poetry. He is currently involved in a national pilot project, together with other high profile writers, developing an e-mail exchange with an East Lancashire primary school. He will be passing on his experience of the project together with teachers from other schools involved.

We will consider realistic timetabling, the role of teamwork, funding and the kind of activities to choose for your event before moving on to planning author visits. Here we look at choosing the most appropriate writer; where to make contact and getting the best value from the visit. Two visiting artists will perform and discuss what they have to offer to the school classroom. Then the focus will naturally turn to effective strategies for promoting your school library to enhance your event!



Mid Pennine is delighted to have been selected to be a part of a national pilot programme to link pupils with a professional writer by e-mail. The programme, inspired by an idea from the Brighton Festival, involves a single class of pupils corresponding with the writer through a weekly e-mail over a half term. At the end of the exchanges the writer visits the school to give a reading and talk to the children followed by a 'tea-party'. Other members of this national pilot include the Belfast Festival, the Cambridge Literature Festival, the Wordplay Children's Literature Festival in Swansea, and Sampad in Birmingham.

Berlie Doherty, based in Edale in Derbyshire, is an award winning writer who writes for the whole age range of school-age pupils, both poetry and prose. She will be working with Sacred Heart Primary School in Colne

John Foster, based in Oxford, is a prolific writer of poetry for children and closely associated with the Oxford Reading Tree series for schools. He will be working with Haslingden Primary School

Julia Donaldson, based in Glasgow, is an award winning writer for children from picture books to young fiction with an interest in music and the dramatisation of her stories. Julia will be working with Wheatley Lane Primary School in Fence.

Kjartan Poskitt, inspirational creator of maths puzzles for children in the 'Murderous Maths' series published by Scholastic will be working with Brunshaw Primary School, Burnley.

Jean Sprackland has been nominated for both the Whitbread and the T.S. Eliot Poetry Prizes this year for her new collection: 'Hard Water' published by Cape. She will be working with an out of school hours writers group at Habergham High School in Burnley

Malorie Blackman, has won a number of children's book awards including The Lancashire Children's Book Award — one of the few awards chosen by children for their peers for her book 'Noughts & Crosses'. She recently featured in Alan Yentob's 'Imagine' series on Children's Literature for the BBC. Malorie will be working with Key Stage 3 pupils at St. Hilda's High School in Burnley




