
New exhibition celebrates Burnley's civic townscape - and looks forward to an ambitious new project

Burnley's proud, stonebuilt architecture is worth celebrating, and a new exhibition starting this week in the town centre does just that.

Kicking off three weeks of concentrated activity, Rock Paper Scissors opens on Thursday 19 June at OneTwoThree, the new high street creative space at 123 St James's Street.



Rock Paper Scissors will also offer the opportunity to hear about an ambitious new project being developed and led by Burnley Council, setting out to engage the people of Burnley with our civic history by focusing on the built and social heritage within Burnley's Civic Core. This is an area of central Burnley which encompasses some remarkable buildings and spaces including the Mechanics Theatre, Central Library and Co-operative Buildings ... these are the proud, stone-built landmarks that mark out its 'civic core' and have a story to tell of Burnley's past, present and future.

The Council have gained support from the National Lottery Heritage Fund to develop this project, called High Five for Heritage, and have been invited to submit a Delivery Phase Application. If successful then, a full, five-year project will kick off from spring 2026.

High Five for Heritage will conserve and safeguard some of our most precious buildings, reshape outdoor public spaces for culture and wellbeing, and involve as many local people as possible in helping shape their town for the future.

Rock Paper Scissors looks forward to that five-year vision. It has been conceived by the independent creative partners of Burnley Cultural Consortium, working together with Burnley Council to make this ambitious project a reality.

OneTwoThree is a new artist-led space in the centre of Burnley and is the flagship building project of Creative Spaces Burnley. A recently restored shop front on St James's Street, part of the Empire Buildings, originally built by the Corporation of Burnley in the 1930s. Painstakingly restored, including all the original stained glass windows, through a partnership between ourselves, Burnley Borough Council and Historic England.

OneTwoThree acts as a central creative hub for Burnley's artist community, supporting organisations and audiences. After much hard work, Burnley's contemporary art community finally has its own place to meet, make, collaborate and share their work - we're ready to welcome members and the public alike.
